Inventing American Gender: Nineteenth Century American Literary Gender and its Uses

This project puts American literary history in conversation with trans studies and Black feminist theory to develop new trans genealogies. The book reads fiction, essays, and archival records to demonstrate that American literature of the long nineteenth century used ideas about gender's capacity for transformation as a rhetorical tool to negotiate with racial and colonial power. This deployment of gender, in turn, offers a deeper cultural history of transness immediately before the invention of the medicalized "transsexual" that points to early Black feminists as intellectual forebears to trans studies.
